- Foundation Meeting – The Library Foundation Board met on January 28. Dennis Pixler's term has expired and people are being considered for the Library Board's approval. The Foundation is sponsoring *A Dinosaur is Loose in the Library* for the Summer Reading Program. The program includes activities such as a fossil digging station and a hatch-your-own-dino egg.
- Fireplace – The fireplace needed a cleaning and parts check as this has not been done since it was installed. Lil' Bit of Country Stoves and Fireplaces from Strawberry Point did an excellent job in getting it back in good working order.
- Fire Sprinkler- The fire sprinkler in the meeting room vestibule was leaking water. Blackhawk Sprinklers replaced it with a new sprinkler.
- Reading Summit- The Summer Reading Program Summit will be held at the Oelwein Library on March 10.
- Tax Assistance – ISU Extension is holding tax preparation assistance at the library on select days in February and March. They have had a good turnout for this program.
- Building Insurance – Vogel Insurance gave updated information on the building and grounds insurance. The deductible is \$25,000. The director will report on how much is the premium and the value and the deductible for the building.
- Programs –
 - Twenty-seven people participated in the activities for the "Bring your Child to the Library" day.
 - Head Start students visited February 11 for Sensory Story Time. LEGO Club will be February 18.
 - The Glass Fusion class is February 28. Twenty-two people have registered; the class is full.
