This new Community Book Club will meet quarterly in Ampersand's fireplace room located at 110 S. Frederick Ave in Oelwein. The focus will be on books about lowa or the Midwest. The first meeting will be on January 25, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. The first book will be The Plea: The True Story of Young Wesley Elkins and His Struggles for Redemption by Patricia L. Bryan.

Brief summary of this book:

On a moonlit night in 1889, lowa farmer John Elkins and his young wife, Hattie, were brutally murdered in their bed. Eight days later, their son, eleven-year-old Wesley Elkins, was arrested and charged with murder. The community reeled with shock by both the gruesome details of the homicides and the knowledge of the accused perpetrator - a small, quiet boy weighing just 75 pounds.
